

# San Marino Directory Returns Home



 $N_{\text{ow that the}}$ negotiations are final, the Chamber is pleased to announce that it has purchased the San Marino Directory from Gloria Hooker, longtime owner of this important community resource. In March, an article in the San Marino Tribune outlined an attempted takeover of the directory by Allan T. Herbert of the Community Directory Company

with the assistance of former San Marino Directory employee Casey Houghton. In the end, Herbert's efforts were unsuccessful. He did however publish and distribute a directory, The San Marino City Directory, in April but it is not The San Marino Directory.

The happy ending to the story is that the Chamber will now retain rights to the name and begin to issue the annual directory, which has been so important to the business and residential community since 1936. The San Marino Directory office will move from its former location to space in the Chamber offices. Cathy Raacke, former Chamber President, has accepted the position as manager of this project. Eve Estrada, Chamber Office Manager, will assist Raacke in updating and re-issuing the book.

Many members of the Chamber and the community helped in the year-long negotiations to keep the Directory in San Marino. Chamber President Barbara Veensta, Chamber Vice President Wayne Carter, CPA Greg McGinley, Attorneys Diane Comi and Diane Corwin, Councilperson Emile Bayle, the San Marino Tribune contributed to the successful conclusion. Recently members of the Chamber Board voted to approve the purchase






# Heard Around Town....
