period since inception of the Chamber, offering





San Marino Disaster Exercise Tuesday, November 17th

City-wide Full Scale Disaster Exercise. Building upon the Great California Shakeout, the City of San Marino will be conducting a city-wide full scale exercise on **November 17th** between **9am and noon.** Utilizing the same devastating Earthquake scenario as the Great Shakeout, all City resources will be mobilized in a response to a variety of simulated emergencies across San Marino. Participating with the city departments will be The Huntington Library and Botanical Gardens, the San Marino Unified School District, the San Gabriel / Pomona Valley Chapter of the America Red Cross, the San Marino/SoPas YMCA, along with many other partners and organizations throughout San Marino. This exercise will provide an unparalleled opportunity for these resources to work together so that when a real disaster strikes, San Marino will be more than prepared. Staying Healthy this Holiday Season

his year, more so than any other, staying healthy will be a challenge. The CDC is reporting that flu activity is now active in 46 states, and our chances of being exposed to the H1N1 virus or more commonly known as the swine flu, are rapidly increasing. How can we protect ourselves? Staying home and avoiding public places is one way, however for most of us it is also completely out of the question.

The average workplace is one of the most common carriers for the flu virus. However, simple steps will keep your office or work place as germ free as possible. Although the best way to keep germs at a minimum is by washing your hands with hot water and soap, often this is impossible. Consider keeping several containers of hand sanitizer readily available for staff, clients and customers. Sanitize your hands after touching things in public areas (i.e. door knobs, handles, counter-tops, telephones etc.). If your business utilizes several phones, assign phones to employees, and wipe down with Lysol anti-bacterial wipes several times through out the day. The flu bacteria can live on items such as phones, counters and computer keyboards for almost 8 hours- so a quick wipe down every couple hours will help.

Retail shop-owners should keep hand sanitizer by their cash registers. One of the worst carriers of germs is paper money. Within minutes a single dollar bill can be transferred from one customer to a clerk, into the register, then taken by another clerk and given as change to yet another customer. One bill, handled by 4 people within minutes. Another popular culprit in the workplace are pens. Consider carrying your own pen and wipe it down several times a day with an anti bacterial wipe.

Ladies...ever check out the bottom of your purse? It is a safe haven for germs. NEVER put it on the floor of a public bathroom or restaurant, or on your kitchen counter. It spreads germs from surface to surface. At least twice a day, wipe the bottom with an antibacterial wipe to disinfect. The same goes for the kids backpacks!

It goes without saying that you must wash your hands with soap and water after using the restroomhowever, a good rule of thumb these days, is to wash your hands each time you pass a sink. But for how long? On a recent TODAY show episode, Dr. Nancy Snyderman offered a simple technique. Sing "happy birthday"- you know the song. As long as it would take you to sing happy birthday is as long as you should be sudsing up those hands. When you're ready for a 2nd song, you're ready to rinse.

Prevention and Treatment

- Get vaccinated. Vaccination is the best protection we have against the flu. Seasonal flu vaccine is available now and initial doses of 2009 H1N1 flu vaccine also are available, with additional doses available later this year.
- Get plenty of sleep. Most doctors recommend 7-8 hours of regular sleep to keep your body running. A run down system cannot fight off infection as easy as a healthy one.
- Wash your hands <u>OFTEN</u> with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcoholbased hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. The majority of germs are spread that way.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. If possible, **DO NOT** put it in your pocket, purse or other place that it can contaminate. If no trash can is available, consider wrapping the infected tissue inside a clean tissue to better help confine the germs until a trash container is available.
- STAY HOME IF YOU ARE SICK! Worth repeating...STAY HOME IF YOU ARE SICK! No job is that important that it cannot wait for a healthy employee. According to the CDC 85% of common colds are spread in offices and schools. If you are sick, you are infecting EVERYONE you come in contact with.
- Keep in mind if you ARE sick, the CDC says you can infect others up to one day prior to feeling symptoms and 5-7 days after. The CDC recommends staying home for at least 24 hours AFTER a fever is gone, except to seek medical attention. Your fever should be gone without the use of fever reducing medicines.
- Keep your home prepared and stocked in case you do get sick with over-the-counter medicines, tissues, hand sanitizers and other related items. If you do get sick, you can avoid unnecessary trips out in public while you're contagious.
- Make sure to wash all bed linens and towels of an infected person regularly to avoid re-infection, and once healthy, get rid of that toothbrush and get a new one!
